

Toledo food firm gets state tax credit

Crikey's Genuine Australian Pies, Toledo, yesterday was given a 50 percent job-creation tax credit for five years by the state tax credit authority.

The credit is for \$64,161 in total, and the company is required to maintain operations at the site for 10 years. The firm plans a \$680,000 project, buying a facility and machinery, retaining six jobs, and creating 49 within three years.

Crikey's is a family-owned frozen food manufacturer, with Australian meat pies as its primary product. It produces, distributes, and packages the pies for grocery chains and hot food truck vendors.
